In Memoriam



Jim B. Huey, was surrounded with the love of "his girls" when he passed peacefully at home on May 19, 2012. He was 75 years young. A lifelong resident of Stockton, Jim farmed in the Delta his entire life with his brothers. Upon retirement in 1989, Jim returned to his love of golf and travel. He also enjoyed the antics of the students at John Adams Elementary School where he volunteered during their lunch hour. He was a member of the Kwan Tze, a social club, at St. Mark's United Methodist Church and the Stockton Chinese Golf Club. Jim was also a member and ardent supporter of the Chinese Cultural Society of Stockton. The son of the late Ock Hoy (father) and Wong Shee Huey (mother), Jim was preceded in death by brothers Glen and Henry Huey. He is survived by his wife of 35 years, Loreen, and daughters Lisa and Jenny. Also surviving him are his siblings George (Pauline), Joe (Alice), May (Dr. Larry Jew), Hong (Mary) and many nieces, nephews, cousins and friends. One of his proudest achievements was being the first to sink a hole-in-one on # 3 at the Brookside Golf and Country Club. He had a total of four holes-in-one during the course of his golfing career. Jim was loved for his sense of humor, kindness, and willingness to help friends and family whenever needed or in various endeavors to benefit the community. His presence will be missed by his buddies on the golf course, his cohorts on casino trips, and relatives at family dinners. A viewing and family service was held Saturday, May 26, at 5:00 p.m. at the Chapel of the Palms, 303 S. California Street, Stockton. The memorial service was held Sunday, May 27, 11:00 a.m. also at the Chapel

of the Palms. Interment was at Park View Cemetery, 3661 E. French Camp Road, Manteca.
