Bonnie Lew, Woman of Achievement 2015

Bonnie Lew, one of the original founders of the Chinese Cultural Society of Stockton and a primary force in the Chinese Folk Dance Troupe, has been named a Woman of Achievement 2015. Selected in the category of Community Service by the San Joaquin County Commission on the Status of Women, she is being honored at a banquet on Sunday, February 15, at the Stockton Golf and Country Club.

Jene Wah Senior Service Agency submitted her nomination for her work. Bonnie's community achievements include several terms as Jene Wah's president as well as her service with CCSS and the folk dance troupe. Other notable achievements include increasing Asian-based resources at the Stockton/San Joaquin Public Library, establishing a media center at Rio Calaveras School, working with the California Civil Liberties Education Program on World War II Japanese-American internment, and establishing the Filipino Focus Group to develop resources in native Filipino languages. In addition, Bonnie coordinated the Census 2000 project to ensure ethnic seniors and immigrants were properly included in the population data.

Among past awards bestowed on Bonnie are the library's Supervisor of the Year 1992, Sertoma Club's Service to Mankind 2000, CCSS Chinese Citizen of the Year 2004, and California State Assembly District 13 Woman of the Year 2014. She is a graduate of the Leadership Stockton Program. She received national recognition when her story of growing up in Mississippi was chronicled by the New York City's Museum of Chinese in America (MOCA) at its grand opening in 2009.

Last year, the Commission honored Loreen Huey, a community activist and current CCSS co-president, as a Woman of Achievement 2014. Other CCSS members in the Women of Achievement ranks are Judith Beuthe, 2009, Mabel Morodomi 2008, Elizabeth Blanchard 2002, Valerie Acoba 1995, Helen Mar 1991, Lois Yee 1984, and Gladys Ikeda 1983.
